## Continuum of Service

Those who serve are the most critical resource to the defense of the United States. Aircraft, logistics, radios, vehicles, weapons – all these and other expensive things are useless without the men and women who pilot, supply, communicate, drive, and fight.

If you look hard and deep enough at the United States, you will see people. That's really what the United States is – people. If you look closer still – close enough to see a small fraction of the population – you will see those who serve, those who are serving, and those who have served in the United States military. Generations come and go but the same three phases continue, overlapping, never stopping. This is the continuum of service. If this flow is broken, the Nation will ultimately die.

Children watch, listen, mature, and consider. Some young men and women volunteer and serve. Older, they look back on one enlistment or a career, or – too often – injuries that cut their service short. None regret their service, but many regret the evident lack of concern by those charged with administering their benefits and care.

The Department of Defense resistance to extending Space Available flight eligibility to 100% service connected disabled veterans, which would cost virtually nothing and which would mean so much to those few who can still travel, is but one example of short-sighted, ill-considered thinking. The DoD also resists the common sense- and justice-driven efforts to eliminate the full offset between Survivors Benefit Plan benefits and Dependency Indemnity Compensation from the Department of Veteran Affairs – the “widow's tax” whereby surviving spouses are punished because their retired veterans died a service connected death. The VA has finally admitted their adjudication performance appraisals have been based for years not on serving veterans, not on error rates, not even on courtesy, but on how many cases were moved off the stack. To paraphrase Don of Don's Guns, “I don't care about the veterans, or accuracy, or even decency folks, I just love to generate impressive numbers as quickly as possible to fool Congress!” Not only do these and similar actions on the part of those charged with assistance to veterans break faith with those who have served, they set examples which lower respect shown military service by society as a whole.

Children watch and listen, and see totally disabled Vietnam veteran grandpa sitting at home, unable to afford a vacation for grandma while there are empty seats wasted on military flights. When grandpa dies they see grandma cheated out of her SBP benefits because his death was service connected. The children see older brother Johnny wait for more than two years for his service connected disability claim to be processed – but Johnny doesn't live to

see it. His PTSD, and being on hold for a half hour on the VA suicide prevention hot line, took his life.

There's a reason that the combat arms enlistment bonus limit was raised to forty thousand dollars after 9/11. Actually three reasons: we were desperate for warm bodies in uniform, young adults are not as stupid as DoD recruiters think, and they grew up watching and listening. Make that four reasons: since 1973 only volunteers enter the military and keep that continuum of service flowing.

The Nation cannot continue to survive long as a nation – to apply short-sighted, shoot-ourselves-in-the-foot policies to those who served. Men and women are children, then young adults, and finally seniors. These are progressive phases in life, not three unrelated subgroups of people. We cannot harm grandpa and grandma and brother Johnny (What have they done for us lately? Who cares about them now? We have limited funding!) without strongly discouraging the young adults we need from entering military service. There is a linkage, a connection, a continuum.

In a perfect world, decisions made and policies implemented regarding recruitment, active duty resources, and veterans benefits would be managed by men and women who are serving or had served in the military. “Bean-counter mentality” would be trumped by those who had “been there”. Unfortunately, the proportion of veterans in government continues to decline with the proportion of veterans in the population. A heavier and heavier load of national defense has fallen on a smaller and smaller proportion of citizens. In this imperfect world, we must rely on the ethics, honor, and sense of duty among non-veterans in government. Without serious efforts at educating legislators, we are up the creek without a paddle.

To forget those who have served is to undermine the future of defense. To be silent is to acquiesce. Bring active duty and veterans benefits issues forward. Hold congressional members feet to the fire. Ask hard questions. Vote accordingly. Preserve the continuum of service. It's more fragile than most in government assume.
