Information from Lori Turpin Hendricks County Veterans Service Officer

Carl (a former manager of a retirement home involved in the Aid and Attendance scam who resigned, by the way), recently asked for assistance in helping a friend of his suffering from PTSD, low income, etc. I sent Carl some basic information. Some others did too, including Ms. Turpin. I'd like you to read the following portions of Ms. Turpin's email to Carl. She's sharper than I am on these benefits, and the information may be just what's needed for some veteran you know who is in a bad situation. Most of her comments pertain to homelessness and financial hardship.

The first thing you need to do is get the veteran to complete the attached application for the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs Military Family Relief Fund. (The application packet, including all required forms, instructions, and the 'mail or fax to' address and number is available online as one long pdf file from https://forms.in.gov then go to "State Forms Online Catalog", then "Department of Veterans Affairs", then enter form number "equals" and "53880", then click the "Search" button.) The law changed July 1 and all wartime veterans are eligible for the fund. They can grant up to \$2500.00. That application goes straight to the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs. They can turn a complete application around in a few days.

I am working on getting the telephone number for the Marion County HVAF and SSVF Social Worker. SSVF can sometimes help with rent payments to help a veteran stay in their apartment.

("HVAF" stands for Hoosier Veterans Assistance Foundation. This organization is described at http://www.uwci.org/aqencies/hvaf-of-indiana-inc Their email address is hvaf@hvaf.org and their telephone number is 317-951-0688. From what I could find out about HVAF, their services are primarily for homeless veterans in Marion and surrounding counties but they will attempt to find housing for any homeless veteran in Indiana.

"SSVF" is Supportive Services for Veteran Families. Basic information is available at

http://www.va.gov/homeless/ssvf/index.asp The organization which administers SSVF for Monroe County is Volunteers of America of Indiana, Inc. based out of Evansville at 1 855 840 4862 or out of Indianapolis at 1 855 332 8387. Here's a sample Question and Answer regarding SSVF from one of their documents:

Question: I am homeless, what do I do?

Answer: SSVF doesn't offer any emergency shelter or transitional housing services. If you need an immediate place to stay, contact your local VA medical center and ask to speak to a representative of the Healthcare for Homeless Veterans Program. You can also visit the Emergency Room of your local VA medical center and speak to a social worker regarding your homelessness. If you have temporary housing and are seeking permanent housing, you can call the toll free SSVF line at 1-855-AWS-SSVF or 1-855-297-7783. If no one answers, please

leave a detailed message including your name and contact phone number and an SSVF case manager will give you a call back shortly.)

There is also a Homeless vet coordinator at the VA Hospital in Indianapolis. That number is 317 988 1400 or 317 988 1435. They work with "near homeless vets" too. If someone is willing to bring the vet out to Danville IN, I can help him file the disability claim or file for the non service connected pension. We would need about 1½ hour appointment for that. There is information that I will need for either application and that needs to be brought by the veteran when he comes for an appointment. (Ms. Turpin's offer regarding pension and compensation application assistance sounds exactly like our Monroe County Department of Veterans Affairs office procedure. Their number is 812 349 2568. Vicky St Myer does the pension and compensation applications.)

You also need to have the veteran contact the township trustee. Several other service organization programs require that the vet first go through the township trustee to get temporary assistance.

Finally, getting him enrolled at the VA hospital ASAP is important. The easiest way is to go to the Enrollment and Eligibility Office at the Hospital on 10th street. The vet needs to take his DD 214 and proof of income. The enrollment could trigger a referral for homeless services. The vet will still need to fill out a separate application for disability or pension. Standing by ready to assist. Thanks, Lori Turpin
