HELP NEEDED

Each month we are required to submit a Community Service Report to Headquarters. Your help is needed to insure Post 604 submits a complete report. The only way this can be accomplished accurately is for you, the member, to let us know of all community service projects you voluntarily participate in.

Below is a list of the categories of community service that are reportable:

- Community Involvement includes but not limited to blood drives, CPR classes, recycling, highway clean-up, or other projects that benefit the community.
- 2. Cooperation with other organizations.
- Aid to others examples are Food Bank, Nursing Home, Senior Citizen Centers, etc.
- 4. **School or Church Assistance** volunteer in School, Speaker of Program in School or Church or other assistance projects.
- Citizenship Education Flag presentation, Color/Honor Guard, Distributed Patriotic Literature, Conducted "Get Out To Vote", Conducted Patriotic Programs in Schools, Veterans day, Pearl Harbor, Memorial Day, Loyalty Day Programs or other Americanism Projects.
- 6. **Safety** Pedestrian safety, Drug Awareness, Recreational Safety, Highway Safety, Home/Fire Safety, Other Safety Projects and Public Recognition
- 7. **Youth Activities** Sports or Athletics, Boy or Girl Scouts, Other Youth Groups, Contests or Special Events, Education, Recognition to Youth Groups.

The above are just some examples of the types of community service projects that can be reported. If you are not sure if your project is reportable, please submit it anyway.

When submitting a report be sure to include **Name**, **Money Spent** (if any), **Number of Hours** (report any portion of an hour as a full hour and be sure to include the time you travel to and from your residence), **Miles Involved**, and a **brief description of the project**. If you have access to email you can send you report to main@vfw-604.org.

If you don't have email capabilities, you can complete an informal short written report and drop it off at the VFW post or bring to monthly meeting with you. Be sure to include the relevant information when submitting a report.

The information received will be consolidated and sent to both state and national headquarters. This will show that the Laurens B. Strain, V.F.W. Post 604 is not a post in name only, but rather a post dedicated to serving God, our fellow veterans, our community, and our great nation.
