Flag Day


Flag Day is a celebration of the adoption of the U.S. flag by Continental Congress on June 14, 1777. The first annual recognition of the flag's birthday is believed to date to 1885 by a schoolteacher named BJ Cigrand. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as Flag Day. In 1937, Pennsylvania became the first state to observe the day as a state holiday. In 1949, Congress designated June 14 as National Flag Day by an Act of Congress. The president delivers an address that proclaims the week of June 14 as National Flag Week. We are encouraged to fly U.S. flags during that week.



Our current American flag, was adopted in 1958 as the U.S. prepared to add Alaska and Hawaii to the union.
