V.F.W. Mission Statement



Space A eligibility for 100% service connected disabled veterans - update

Congressman Todd Young has, after full and careful consideration, decided not to introduce legislation to provide Space Available travel eligibility for 100% service connected disabled veterans.

Tim Welter, Congressman Young's legislative director, called to explain. The Department of Defense has historically been opposed to expanding Space A eligibility for a variety of reasons. The DoD published an opposing position paper on this topic in 2007. Tim sent me a copy as an email attachment.

While both Tim and I agreed that some of the DoD objections were bogus and others were certainly stretched, the most telling objection was that DoD was predicting that the number of available Space A seats would progressively decline during the next few years and they did not want to expand eligibility. This is not an "anti-100% service connected disabled veteran" argument, this is just their view of the future and their attempt to protect Space A usage for those already eligible.

After reading the DoD paper, and after Polly and I returned from traveling to and from California on KC-135 (in-flight refueling tanker) aircraft last week and observing the safety hazards for any "mobility challenged" passengers, I was pretty down on the Space A for 100% vets idea myself.

Then came an e-mail from Joe Davis, the Director of Public Affairs, VFW Washington Office. (Joe was responding to an e-mail I had sent a few weeks ago to the VFW national office on this same topic.) Joe had read the same DoD objections that Congressman Young, Tim Welter, and I had and was still decidedly "up" on the idea of Space A for 100% service connected disabled veterans. Instead of me buttering up Joe to get his support, he ended up restoring my enthusiasm! While one door has closed, the national VFW office just might, with their clout, be opening another.

"Aid and Attendance" scam update

Some of you may have noticed the ad in the Herald-Times last week for a veterans' seminar regarding Aid and Attendance at a local retirement living facility. Lest I get myself in too much legal trouble, let me just suggest that you go to your own personal computer and do your own search for "Aid and Attendance fraud". You will discover many articles on this topic, including a special warning from the AARP. There are many unscrupulous people making money by preying on the trust of wartime veterans and the only people at risk are the veterans themselves. One ploy is to offer to do the A&A application forms for free (which, of course, your VFW service officer, any other military organization service officer, the Monroe County Veterans Service Officer you get the idea, many trustworthy people – would also do for free) and then advise the veteran to restructure his financial assets to get his net worth within the VA "needsbased" pension limits. Funny thing - the financial products the nice people advise the veteran to move his money into all pay big commissions to the nice people. This is not illegal, it's just totally unethical. There are other hazards, including having to pay back any benefits the VA discovers were awarded through a fraudulent claim. Be very careful.

BUDDY POPPY

The VFW conducted its first poppy distribution before Memorial Day in 1922, becoming the first veterans' organization to organize a nationwide distribution. The poppy soon was adopted as the official memorial flower of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

It was during the 1923 encampment that the VFW decided that VFW Buddy Poppies be assembled by disabled and needy veterans who would be paid for their work to provide them with some form of financial assistance. The plan was formally adopted during the VFW's 1923 encampment. The next year, disabled veterans at the Buddy Poppy factory in Pittsburgh assembled VFW Buddy Poppies. The designation "Buddy Poppy" was adopted at that time.

In February 1924, the VFW registered the name "Buddy Poppy" with the U.S. Patent Office. A certificate was issued on May 20, 1924, granting the VFW all trademark rights in the name of Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers. The VFW has made that trademark a guarantee that all poppies bearing that name and the VFW label are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans. No other organization, firm or individual can legally use the name "Buddy" Poppy.

Today, VFW Buddy Poppies are still assembled by disabled and needy veterans in VA Hospitals.

The minimal assessment (cost of Buddy Poppies) to VFW units provides compensation to the veterans who assemble the poppies, provides financial assistance in maintaining state and national veterans' rehabilitation and service programs and partially supports the VFW National Home for orphans and widows of our nation's veterans.


From the Trustees
