Veterans' Memorial Plaza Dedication

(VFW Post 604 was asked for assistance during the design phase for the new Veterans' Memorial area within Valhalla Memory Gardens. More recently, Valhalla and the donors for the Plaza requested Post 604 include the dedication within this year's Memorial Day ceremonies. Here's what might be said during that dedication.)

This Veterans' Memorial Plaza, like Memorial Day itself, honors veterans who have passed away from this Earth – veterans of all wars and veterans who served but were not called to war. All placed their lives at risk so that we might have the freedoms we enjoy today.

The central stone, the tallest, bears the Great Seal of the United States. All veterans swore an oath to defend and protect the Constitution of the United States. We will now pledge our allegiance. The words are inscribed on the stone. *(Lead the crowd in the Pledge.)*

We see the Army's stone as on the viewers' left of the United States stone, but it is on the United States stone's right hand – according to tradition, the first position of shared honor. The Army is the oldest of the military branches of the United States, tracing back to the 19th of April, 1775 at the battles of Lexington and Concord which began the American Revolutionary War. The Army motto is "This We'll Defend."

Marine Corps history is slightly shorter than the Army's – but don't tell them that. Every year Marines celebrate the 10th of November, the birthday of the Corps in 1775. The Marine Corps stone is on the United States stone's left hand, the traditional position of second highest honor. The Marine Corps motto is "Semper Fidelis" which means "Always Faithful".

The Navy stone is one place further out from the Army stone. The Navy would have been in second place, claiming their first birthday of the 13th of October 1775, but the Continental Navy was disbanded after the Revolutionary War and the current Navy was reestablished on the 27th of March 1794. The Navy has two mottoes, the official is, "Semper Fortis", which has a dual meaning in English: "Always powerful, always courageous". The unofficial is "Non sibi sed patriae", meaning "Not for self for country".

The Air Force stone is one place further out from the Marine Corps stone. Harry Truman was, appropriately enough, airborne on an aircraft – which we would now call Air Force One – when he signed the National

Security Act of 1947. The Act created the Air Force as a separate branch of the United States military. The Air Force was born on 18th of September 1947, the day the first Secretary of the Air Force, Stuart Symington, took office. The Air Force motto is, "Aim High ... Fly – Fight – Win".

The Coast Guard stone is one place further out from the Army and Navy stones. Their birthday being on the 4th of August 1790, in times of declared war the Coast Guard falls under the Department of Defense and bumps in front of the Air Force. In times other than declared war the Coast Guard falls under the Department of Homeland Security and, while still recognized as a branch of the military, is listed in precedence after the Air Force. The Coast Guard motto is, "Semper Paratus" meaning always prepared.

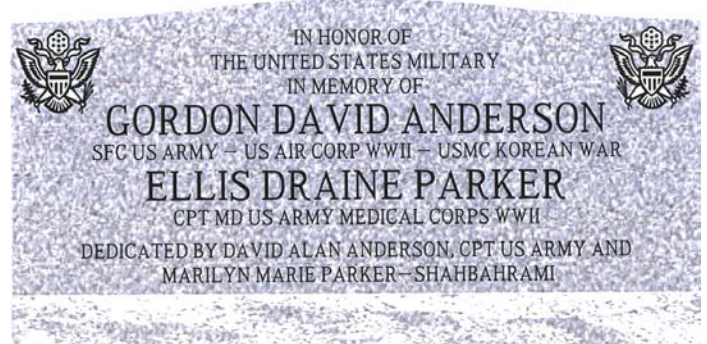
The Prisoners of War – Missing in Action stone is one place further out from the Marine Corps and Air Force stones. The POW-MIA motto is, "Never Forgotten". While POW-MIA is not a branch of military service each meeting of each military service organization of the United States and each dining facility in each military facility around the world always has a table set with a symbolic empty chair in remembrance of the prisoners of war and those still missing in action. Nor are the prisoners and the missing forgotten here today. Let us observe a few moments of silence in remembrance of those who did not yet come home. *(Lower head. Silence for about ten seconds.)*

(Raise head, big voice.) May this Veterans' Memorial Plaza stand hereby today dedicated in memory of Gordon David Anderson, Sergeant First Class, US Army, US Air Corps WWII, US Marine Corps Korean War; and Ellis Draine Parker, Captain, Medical Doctor, US Army Medical Corps WWII; dedicated by David Alan Anderson, Captain, US Army and Marilyn Marie Parker-Shahbahrami.

(Step forward, cut the ribbon, bagpipes strike in. Proceed with remainder of Memorial Day ceremonies.)
